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Catholic Health Initiative Mission & Ministry Fund Awards Grants for Intimate Partner Violence Prevention Work

Bismarck, ND — Catholic Health Initiatives (CHI) Mission & Ministry Fund recently granted funding to violence prevention coalitions in seven CHI communities for the next three years. These communities include Carrington, Devils Lake, Dickinson, Lisbon, Oakes, Valley City and Williston. The total award for the seven communities is \$940,811. Veronica Zietz was named director of the violence prevention initiative.

The purpose of the initiative is to create communities free of intimate partner violence in North Dakota. By building referral networks and partnerships with training and technical assistance by North Dakota Council on Abused Women's Services and Futures Without Violence, area professionals and organization will learn how to incorporate intimate partner violence prevention education into their existing work. Additionally, the initiative will look to increase the impact of prevention efforts by educating women at risk of intimate partner violence.

In North Dakota, 31 percent of women have experienced intimate partner violence. Domestic disputes are among the most common calls for police services and have steadily risen in our state over the last few years. Through CHI's intimate partner violence prevention program, our communities will have a means to mitigate and stop violence within North Dakota; creating safer and healthier places to live, work and play.
